Polaris World and the Environment

As Murcia is one of the driest regions in Spain Polaris World is keenly aware of the potential damage its developments could have caused the local ecosystems and environment.

With this in mind Polaris World has built its own Desalination Plant near Mazarron which will produce over 56,000 m³ of water per day, enough to supply over 200,000 people for an entire year.



This in-house system will also provide enough water to meet the additional needs of regional tourism. The Plant turns seawater into drinking water fit for human consumption whilst the wastewater produced will be used for watering the gardens and golf courses following a purifying process.

Polaris also owns Europe's largest plant nursery allowing plants to acclimatise before including them in the resorts to further minimise any potential impact on the environment
